## **Successful Election**

A successful election campaign depends quite heavily on the efforts put in by all Candidates. The following list of campaign ideas can be utilized to aid you in your campaign.

- Candidates can post within the social media accounts provided to the SA. If posts are
  deemed inappropriate in any way, you will be asked to take it down. Failure to do so
  within 24 hours will result in demerits, additional demerits may be assigned for noncomplaints as assigned by the CRO.
- With on-campus elections, you should make yourself available to students at all campuses. Having a campaign team support you will help get your name, face, and promises out to students.
- Candidates (or campaign team designate) <u>must</u> be present for the information session on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 28, 2023 at 4:00 pm held</u> through MS Teams or be subject to demerits.
- Candidate posters, banners and positioning statements may be posted by the RRCSA on RRCSA media outlets such as TVs, poster boards, website, and social media.
- Candidate posters and banners should be up before the campaigning starts.
- Record your candidate speech @ NDC 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. (2 takes max) Thursday, March 2, 2023, or @ EDC 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. (2 takes max) on Friday, March 3, 2023
- Candidate speeches will pe played at SA Monthly Info Meetings on March 14, 2023 @ NDC and on March 16, 2023 @ EDC.
- Set up a campaign table in the hallways to promote yourself during the campaign period.
- Put up large hallway banners at NDC and EDC to promote yourself. Banner paper and paint will be provided. The SA will put up the banners for the candidates.
- Candidates may need to meet with the CRO and/or Elections, Appointment and Referenda Committee prior to being approved as a candidate to review their nomination package and answer any eligibility questions.
